Potting soil vs. garden soil

If you want your plants to thrive, you need to use the right type of soil. Here's a look at the difference between potting soil and garden soil.

Potting Soil

Potting soil has a mixture of organic materials and minerals that help plants grow in containers. Moss, compost and other matter feeds the plants, while minerals like perlite and vermiculite facilitate drainage and prevent the soil from compacting. Additionally, potting soil is sterile, which protects plants from fungi and other pathogens.

Garden Soil

Garden soil is regular dirt enriched with compost or other organic materials. It can be used to create and maintain gardens or raised beds to ensure the soil contains enough nutrients to support plant life. Without additives like perlite, garden soil doesn't provide enough drainage for potted plants, but it can help pre-



vent flower beds from drying out by retaining moisture. It's also more affordable than potting mixes.

If you're not sure what type of soil you need, speak with an expert at your local farmers market, nursery or garden centre.

Why use a rain gauge in the garden?

A rain gauge is a practical instrument that measures rainfall.

Using a rain gauge can help you adapt your watering schedule to avoid over or underwatering your plants. However, to make good use of the data you collect, you must first know how much water each type of plant requires.

You can use a rain gauge to compare the amount of rainfall from year to year, which can help you plan your future crops.



How to grow microgreens

Microgreens contain more nutrients than mature vegetables and can be used to add colour, texture and flavour to a variety of dishes. Some of the simplest microgreens to grow are broccoli, cabbage, collards, mustard and radish. Here's how to do it.

- 1. Cover the bottom of a seed-starting tray with about five to seven centimetres of damp potting soil.
- 2. Scatter the seeds over the soil in an even layer, then cover them with a

bit more damp soil.

3. Mist the surface using a spray bottle, and repeat this once or twice a day to keep the soil damp but not soaked.

- 4. Place the container on a sunny windowsill once the sprouts appear, and continue to mist the plants daily.
- 5. Harvest the microgreens when they're about three to seven centimetres tall (after one to three weeks) using scissors to cut them at soil level.

Rinse your microgreens and use

them in salads, sandwiches or as a garnish. They can be stored in a sealed container in the fridge for about a week.





After decluttering, reward yourself with a relaxing massage or meal out.



How to keep your lawn healthy



Do you want your lawn to look great all summer? Adopt these practices.

- Sharpen your lawnmower blades. Clean-cut grass grows back faster than grass that's been ripped or torn.
- Leave the clippings on the ground. They'll slowly release nitrogen. However, avoid leaving a layer thicker than half a centimetre. This will smother the grass.
- Mow more often but leave it longer. Cutting your grass to a height of six to eight centimetres promotes root development and grass density. It also makes the grass less vulnerable to drought.
- Water only as needed. Water your grass to a depth of about two and a half centimetres a week, including rainfall. Water in the morning to limit evaporation.
- Apply compost. This provides essential nutrients, stimulates root growth and increases resistance to diseases and pests.

Garden shed considerations

Do you need storage space for your barbecue, patio set and gardening accessories? If so, it's time to get a shed. There are many prefabricated models made of synthetic materials, metal and wood. Here are a few tips for making the right choice.

Synthetic materials

Plastic, vinyl and PVC sheds are resistant to water and insect damage. Moreover, they require very little maintenance. Although available in a wide variety of designs, they tend to have a commercial look that may not suit everyone.

Metal

Metal sheds are lightweight, affordable and easy to assemble. If made from aluminum, the shed won't rust. However, metal sheds are easy to dent and come in fewer designs than those made of synthetic materials.

Wood

Wooden sheds are sturdy and can complement the outside of your home. However, they require considerable maintenance and are more vulnerable to insects and rot than metal and synthetic sheds.

If you're handy, you can design and build your own shed. This way, you can choose its size and appearance. Furthermore, you can insulate the walls to create a workshop. But keep a close eye on your budget. This type of project can easily cost several thousand dollars

Whether you choose to buy a prefabricated shed or build your own, make sure it's strong enough to withstand inclement weather. Finally, check the laws and regulations in your municipality for building this type of structure.



When to prune your trees and shrubs

Although trees and shrubs can grow very well without intervention, occasional pruning helps promote optimal health. Here's what you need to know.

Flowering

Shrubs like rhododendrons and lilacs bloom from last year's stems, whereas others, like roses and hydrangeas, bloom from new growth. It's best to prune shrubs that flower from old wood immediately after blooming. However, shrubs that bloom on new growth should be trimmed in the spring.

Dormancy

In general, shrubs and trees go dormant in the spring before their buds open. This is the best time for pruning because the plants heal faster. Late fall is also appropriate. However, pruning in the winter should be avoided.

Furthermore, mid-summer is ideal for pruning trees that produce a lot of sap in the spring, like maple, birch and willow.

Lastly, pruning large trees and fruit trees should be left to the experts. For the best results, contact a professional tree pruner in your area.





Raised gardening is the practice of growing plants above ground level. Here are five reasons why this method is becoming increasingly popular among gardeners.

What's late blight, and how do you prevent it?

Late blight is a plague known to many farmers because it affects several types of crops, including grapes, potatoes, tomatoes, gourds and peppers. No gardener, amateur or professional, is immune to this unpleasant issue. Find out a little more about late blight and how to prevent it.

Causes

Late blight is a disease caused by a fungus that develops in the earth when temperatures are warm and humidity is high. It can then spread to the plant's lower leaves, potentially leading to the loss of the entire crop. Late blight tends to set in when a plant has a deficiency of the nutrients that defend against fungus and related diseases.

Symptoms

Plants affected by late blight see their leaves turn brown and dry up. A white, downy covering may form under the leaves, and the fruits and vegetables may also show similar signs as the disease spreads. It gradually leads to the death of the plants.

To prevent late blight, it's important to eliminate the conditions that cause it. That means controlling the humidity level around the plants and avoiding water
