Virden Collegiate Institute

"We've got a little green spot in our front entrance way to our school," said Virden Collegiate Institute Prin-cipal Mark Keown. "What we're going to do is have a slotted drive up type of approach to that spot. Grads will pull up with their families, jump out, come up a little red carpet, get a presentation in front of our building outside as long as weather permits, otherwise we'll slide into

— as long as weather permits, otherwise we it state into our gym to do that.

"Each grad will come up through during their slot, they'll have whatever time that takes probably 10 to 15 minutes. That will be happening from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. throughout the day and then we're kind of congre gating back to see if we can have a little bit of a cruise around town a little later.

"We're still waiting on final approval for the cruise," he said. "But the plan is to have a little bit of a cruise where the grads line up and drive through town to let everybody see the kids going through the process.

In at iooss isse the extent, just because or our num-bers with 72 grads. It's tough to meet the regulations of a maximum of 50 in an outdoor setting to pull that off. We talked through lots of other options, but this was the one that logistically meets the requirements and is doable. "We're appreciative of the school division," he said.

"The superintendent was adamant that he wanted to have something done in June. With delaying it to the fall, you just don't know if we'll be in an any better state or if people will be able to come back. We're pretty hap-py to just have something."

Borderland hires many students each year to work in all our locations. The students learn about the co-operative retail system while obtaining valuable work experience.

Students make up one quarter of our employee complement. Their dedication and commitment is appreciated by all the staff and members of Borderland Co-op.

Students who work at Borderland Co-op an average of 15 hours a week over a period of a year earn the entitlement of a bursary of \$100 per year upon graduation.
