Redvers brings back Rockin the Block on Sept. 10

On Saturday Sept. 10 the community of Redvers will be hosting Rockin the Bock. The all-day event will consist of activities, local shopping and food, as well as a live

performance by Fog Dog.

"We're starting the day at 2 p.m., we're going to be having a petting zoo, face painting, inflatable bouncers and obstacle courses, a show and shine, a money pit for the kids," said Michelle Jensen of the Rockin the Block Committee.

"Then there will be a supper by Weir's Catering and Morgan Robinson will be performing immediately after supper. For the social the doors open at 8 p.m. and we'll

have Fog Dog performing.

"The majority of the events will be happening on the business sector of Main Street, then the supper and performances will be at the rec centre.'

Jensen said events like these in town bring the commu-

nity together and help benefit the town financially too. "It's an opportunity to bring the community together, it's great for economic development by getting people from out of and in town on to Main Street checking out

our local businesses," she said.

"We did it last as sort of a post-Covid party, people needed to get out and be together. It went so well that everyone asked us when we were doing it again.
"Of course we're looking forward to the event being

a little bit bigger than last year. We understand that it is during harvest, which is a tough time, but around here s never a perfect time to do anything like this.

"In spring we've got seeding and grads, in summer there's weddings and people are off camping or on holi-days, and stuff like that."

Jensen said a lot of preparation has gone towards the

"The committee consists of three of us, we've been working hard to put everything together. It does take a lot of work because we want to try and keep everything free or as affordable as possible, I've been busy trying to look for grants, funding and sponsors," she said.

"We've managed to cover a good portion of the expenses for the day. It's free for people to attend, the only things being charged are the supper tickets, which are \$27.50 per ticket which covers your full meal and the show. Then the social in the evening with Fog Dog is \$10 at the door."

People can buy their supper tickets in advance at Red-

vers town office, everything else will be sold at the door.

"The golf course is having their Hole in One Tournament that day too, and will be having their horse race afterwards as well."

Jensen spoke about how the idea for hosting a commu-

nity day event came up.
"I'm on town council, it was myself and the mayor Brad Bulbuck that sort of spun the idea around that an event like this would be really good for the town to bring everyone together, and that's where it started from," Jensen said.

"There's going to be so much to do on that day, the kids will be a week in from being back to school, it's a nice time to get back together because you find in summer that you're travelling and you don't get to see everyone as often. It's nice to come together before dance, hockey and all those things are eating up your time again."

Jensen said she is thankful for the community support

and sponsors that contributed to help making the day

happen.
"I'd really like to thank our sponsors, the Redvers Rockets Field of Dreams, Redvers Arts Centre Founda-tion, Redvers Wildlife, ERP and Manor Agencies, Redvers Lions Club, Nutrien Ag Solutions, and the petting

zoo is from Saddle Ridge Farm."

Jensen said it was not hard getting the community's
