On Friday, Sept. 15, the Wellness Grade 10 class of Rocanville organized a Terry Fox Walk for students.

Students of the wellness class hosted the assembly and cooked hamburgers and hotdogs for the school's barbecue.

Last year, students raised almost \$1,100 from the day in support of the Terry Fox Foundation.

"We are celebrating our annual Terry Fox Walk for Rocanville's K-12 school," said Alison Yaroszko of the Wellness Grade 10 class.

"As a Grade 10 Wellness class we came together to keep spreading awareness of the marathon of hope, and to honor the legacy of

Terry Fox.

"This meets a lot of our outcomes, it meets leadership, it meets volunteering in the community, and just brings the community together. Also it just celebrates big things like the Terry Fox Foundation."

During the assembly, Grade 10 students quizzed teachers and students with Terry Fox trivia questions. Nutrien donated the prizes given to the winners. Borderland Co-op also donated the food and juice boxes for the barbecue.

"It feels good to do this, and it's nice because our community has had a lot of people who got involved," Yaroszko said.

"Also our class came all together just under two

weeks to pull this off.

"It felt a little rushed at first, but then once we got our jobs put together everything was smooth sailing."

Having students and people in the Rocanville community participate in the Terry Fox Walk is important, said Yaroszko.

"It's really important, not just for the community, but for the whole country," she said.

"Terry Fox has shown a lot of bravery and has encouraged a lot of people to help others too."

The walk and run was 1.3 km with each classes teacher leading it.

"Whenever a Shrine patient goes in for an appointment, all of the travel expenses are paid for by the provincial organization and all of the medical treatment that they get is taken care of by the Shrine hospitals which the provincial clubs donate to as well.

"The 50 per cent that we keep and that stays in the community, we get to spend towards local initiatives that we think are important and a priority for kids in the community. So even though the patients already get the free treatment and travel expenses, we can still do a top up of that and it's donated locally by the Shrine Club. It's not only for Shrine patients, we're also donating to projects that we think need some support and we've given towards projects like the Terry Lynd Basketball Court and we donated a bench for the Age Friendly group. This year we also donated a wagon to the school to help them with access for kids with mobility issues and certain projects like that in town."

He said the fundraiser is one of the main sources of funds for the local Shrine club.

"We have three fundraisers that we do," he said. "The first is the Rose Day in the spring/summer, then we have the concert later in the year and then we also have calendars."

"Our biggest event that has been growing over the years is the concert. We've been doing better every year. We started with fewer tables—we started smaller and now it's kind of growing to be a big fundraiser for us."

Full evening of entertainment

This year the Shriners have a full evening of entertainment planned.

"We have JJ Voss as our main act, Lachlan Neville as the opening and The Kelly Brothers will be the closing band," says Ilustrisimo.

"It's going to be a good evening. Lachlan is a very talented, young musician from Rocanville and JJ Voss is also a talented Saskatchewan artist. He was named best new Saskatchewan Artist in 2022 I believe and then of course The Kelly Brothers are very well-known in the Rocanville and Moosomin areas and are really good entertainers. It's going to be a good night of music for a good cause."

"This year we're also having a silent auction for some gift cards from town and some prizes. It's going to be a good cause and hopefully people will support our event again. We've always had great support locally and we

always sell out our concerts so hopefully that will be the same case this year." There will also be an auction for two tickets anywhere Westjet flies.

Event takes lots of work

Ilustrisimo says a lot of work goes into the fundraiser.

"It's a lot of work and a lot of preparation. We started the preparations in early spring. There are five of us on the committee and there will be a few more groups help-

ing us like the Filipino Community and there might be some other local clubs to help us as well. So it's basically like a big community project and of course we couldn't do it without all of the local sponsors helping us with the prizes and the hotels."

"It's a big project but since we've been doing it every year and have had consistent support from the community, that's what makes our event successful—the support of the community."

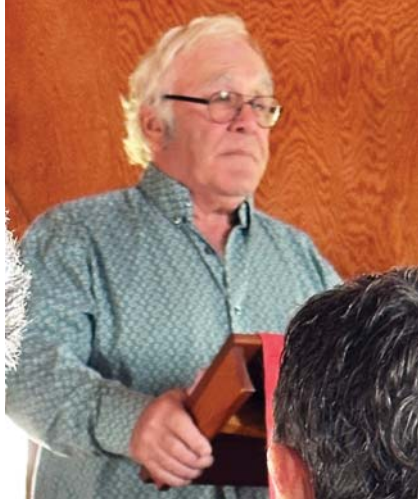

Sask recruiting health care workers from other provinces

That's where there's a finite amount of people to fill these very important positions, highly trained individuals who we are very grateful for having in our province, working in the healthcare portfolio, and we just simply can't find enough of those people as quickly as we would like.

We are again hopeful that through the recruitment incentives that we have a new permanent full-time position we have created, with some of the recruitment being done by the Health Recruitment Agency. Following up on some of the previous work that has been done in the Philippines and elsewhere, continuing to look for each and every worker in our province that is interested in working health care and trying to find them a position in a facility. Whether it is full time—and some aren't, some are looking for part time positions for a variety of reasons—but making sure that we really leave no stone unturned when it comes to this. Adding more training

seats, 550 more training seats this fall, 18 different healthcare designations. We know we're not going to see the benefits of that for a few years depending on what that profession might be and how long the training is for that particular profession. That being said, we are seeing the benefits of some of the previous expansions that we've done in the earlier years, for example for a combined lab and x-ray tech, we have expanded some training in that regard and we are seeing more graduates come through that program. We are trying to make sure that we do this as quickly as we can so that the people can have the health care in their communities that they need and deserve.

When you look at this whole recruitment initiative, do you look at it and say okay, this is working, the more time we give it the more it will work, we got it cased, or is it a case where even more needs to be done to solve the issue?

I would say it's always continuous improvement, we are always looking at our various programs. What is it we are doing to try to recruit, but also repay health care workers in our province, we need to continue to do that. As an example, the rural position incentive program which had been in place for a number of years, we made some adjustments to that this spring in the budget by increasing the amount of funds available in that particular incentive up to \$200 000 for five years now. Initially that program had been working very well, but you are always looking at how do you best meet the needs of those that are looking to work in health care knowing that it is very competitive, not just in our country but elsewhere as well, particularly when they are in high demand right across the globe I would say.

For us we are always looking at what is working and what can we do to make sure we continue to be competitive here in our province when it comes to training, retaining and recruiting health care workers.

Sask delegation preparing for national health care worker recruitment

The Saskatchewan Healthcare Recruitment Agency (SHRA) and the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) will kick off its first National Health Care Recruitment Tour later this month to promote employment opportunities, benefits and incentives available in the province.

"As part of our recruitment efforts, we will continue to promote our province as the great place it is, offering a lower cost of living, excellent wages and benefits, plus strong health care teams and wonderful communities to join," Health Minister Everett Hindley said. "With the health care career opportunities and incentives in place, there has never been a better time to con-

sider a move to Saskatchewan."

The newly established SHRA, led by CEO Erin Brady, will be joining SHA recruiters for the first time to meet with health care professionals, students and post-secondary institutions in Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland from September 22 to October 6.

"I look forward to being a part of the team to recruit professionals from various in-demand health-care occupations to meet current and future resourcing needs, as well as showcase Saskatchewan," SHRA CEO Erin Brady said.

Westman RCMP Report

59 calls for service

Three drivers operating phones

Semi runs a red light

On September 3, Westman RCMP were approaching the traffic lights at King Street and Highway 1 in Virden. RCMP had a green light and as they approached the intersection they observed a semi-truck and trailer proceed through the intersection, running a red light. A traffic stop was conducted with the semi. The driver was fined \$203 for disobeying the traffic control device.

Domestic assault on Sioux Valley

On September 3, Westman RCMP received a dispatch of a disturbance in Sioux Valley Dakota Nation. RCMP attended the scene and learned a domestic assault had occurred. A male was arrested and transported to Virden RCMP. The male was released on an undertaking with a November court date.

House engulfed in flames

On September 3, Westman RCMP received a dispatch of a house fire in Sioux Valley Dakota Nation. RCMP attended, and the fire department was already on scene. The house was empty with no occupants and was fully engulfed in flames.

Man looking for medications

On September 4, Westman RCMP received a dispatch of a transient male individual going to the hospital asking for medications that are not prescribed to him while he travels west. He was denied the medication and asked to leave the hospital. The male returned and was arrested by police. He was held in cells overnight and released the next morning to continue traveling west.

\$391 speeding ticket

On September 4, Westman RCMP

were conducting patrols of Highway 1 when police observed a speeding vehicle traveling 136 km/hr in the 110 km/hr zone. A traffic stop was conducted and the driver was fined \$391 for speeding.

Bridge Road Developments new owner of Pipestone Villas

"I think what makes the difference in the Moosomin community is that people pull together, they try to do the best thing for their neighbors," he said.

"If you've ever been to Unity, there's a sign that says 'God smiles on people that live in Unity,' and I think that's what really happened here."

"Every time we had a problem in Moosomin, someone would say 'we can solve that,' whereas in other places, someone would say 'that's not our problem you fix it.' Well, it's not something that can be fixed by a board or by an owner, it has to be fixed internally."

Funk said Bridge Road is open to the possibility of investing into future developments in the community.

"We're always interested in a community that's strong," he said.

"Moving forward, if we continue to draw people here, there is a going to be growth. Whenever you have a hub, it's going to draw more people."

"Anyone from this region who doesn't want to go to Regina or Saskatoon or Brandon, is going to say they want to be here, in

Moosomin."

Being able to turn over the ownership of Pipestone Villas to Bridge Road Developments was very rewarding, said Wayne Beckett, who served as president of the Pipestone Villas board until the purchase.

"It feels really good, the satisfying part is that it's going to be a smooth and seamless transition," Beckett said.

"Because Bridge Road has been a part of this since day one, the tenants know of them, and they're well-

received in a lot of similar communities.

"Between Bridge Road being part of it and it carrying on with the staff, including Bernie and Brad (Nosterud), it will make the transition almost seamless."

Beckett spoke about why the original investors of Pipestone Villas decided to sell their ownership.

"There was never a target, but most of the investors were at the age where it wasn't a 20 year plan, it was 10 years or less," he said.

"When we started considering it, we didn't put it on the open market so we don't know if there was interest from far away, but Bridge Road stepped up once we started talking about it and that's where the discussion ended."

The Pipestone Villas Board intentions for building the senior housing facilities in Moosomin was based on the need for it in the community.

"As you know Bill Thorn is a good influencer," Beckett said.

"He had a vision, and the

economic situation at that time was pretty strong. The mine expansion was going on, there were lots of good jobs, it seemed like the timing was really good.

"When Bill had this idea, he approached people in the community, I'm not sure how many people he approached, but he ended up with 15 investors."

He said investors stepped up initially for multiple reasons. "For sure you want to get a return on your money, it doesn't matter where you put your money, you want to get

a return but, on the social side of it, the social impact is pretty significant, and Bill did a great job in communicating that.

"Once we got everyone on board for the plan and once it was running in the first few years everyone knows there's lots of issues, but once it was running well, we knew we had a successful business and that it may not be hard to sell, if we all agreed to it."

"I think that's an advantage this particular facility has over several other properties that Bridge Road is involved with, is that I think everyone would agree it's one of the best managed facilities they have. It's the model that they would use for other properties."

"We are pretty proud. The social impact is just as important as the financial return. We accomplished everything right from the start."

"Hats off to Bill for having the vision and the desire to push everyone who bought in, including the tenants, and now with Cobblestone, that's just another added attraction that will benefit even further for years and years to come."
