



# Conexus Convention Centre and Communiplex a hub for winter activity

Every winter, the Conexus Convention Centre and Communiplex in Moosomin are a hub of activity.

The Convention Centre was designed to be a multipurpose facility, and it has truly hit the mark. Once winter arrives the facility plays host to a ton of events, from public gym nights to gymnastics and air cadets, and many, many private bookings such as trade shows and entertainment events

For those looking for some indoor public skating and shinny time, both are available at the Communiplex throughout the winter. Skating and shinny times can be found on the Moosomin Parks and Rec website at www. moosomin.com/parksandrec.

River Hockey is also available to children who want to play hockey without the pressure of league play. Kids can sign up for river hockey any time of the year, and shinny style hockey is played every weekend.

For adults wanting to indulge in a little bit of rec hockey there are options. Men's rec hockey is played each week.

Times vary each week, but these programs are open to any adult.

The Communiplex is also a great place to catch a local hockey game—be it minor hockey or a game between the town's senior team, the Moosomin Rangers, and one of their opponents in the North Central Hockey League.

The Convention Centre is also well used by community groups, such as the gymnastics club, the air cadets, and renting it for birthday parties has also been a big hit.

The Convention Centre and outdoor rink are fairly recent additions to Bradley Park, and Moosomin Rec Director Mike Schwean says everything has worked out the way the town hoped, with the entire facility humming with activity on a regular basis.

"It's exactly what we planned, it worked out perfect," he says. "It's busy all the time.

"It's not so much a revenue producer as it is payback to the community—lots of different groups have been able to use it."



## Sportsplex a winter recreation destination

Moosomin's Nutrien Sportsplex is a unique venue that has been recognized with awards by both the Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association and the Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association.

"I'm thrilled, because it was a unique undertaking, and the fact that it has been recognized by both SUMA and the Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association shows that it was a good decision," says Moosomin Recreation Director Mike Schwean.

The Sportsplex had its start when the town had the bowling alley turned over to it, and a community needs assessment was completed nine years ago. The needs assessment identified the need for a dedicated park space for community events, the need for nontraditional recreation opportunities, the need for winter leisure opportunities and the need for more diversified recreation opportunities.

Schwean says the facility—with everything from bowling lanes and billiards to a walking track, pickleball court and sports simulators—was meant to serve all ages.

"When we were planning it, we wanted to be able to offer programming for adults and seniors and kids. One of the biggest successes of the entire project has been offering programming to seniors. In the past we just didn't have winter programming for that demographic.

"When I look at it now, it's better than what I had envisioned. We were looking for diversity and to accommodate everyone, and I think between exercise classes and the walking groups, and the simulators, and the parties, and the health region using it, we're working with all dif-ferent demographics. With all the parties, we're bringing a lot of people to the community."

The Sportsplex now includes the pre-existing bowling alley, billiards, four sports simulators, an indoor walking track, two indoor pickleball courts, large raised decking, a large outdoor stage, ground level rubber decking, a flag garden, and a park area. Activities are hosted there on a regular basis, including weekly golf leagues, fitness classes, seniors programming, league bowling, and a large number of walkers make use of the walking track, which the recreation department has tried to make more interesting by starting challenges where walkers walk across the province or the country reaching certain milestones after a certain number of laps.

"For the people in town who use it, it's great," says Schwean." There are so many people who use it, from walkers to golfers, and they all love it. We hear so many positive comments. It's provided exactly what we wanted it to. It's provided an opportunity to stay active in the winter for people who didn't have an opportunity for that before." 








## Moosomin's outdoor rink well used

In the town of Moosomin—where indoor ice time is quickly booked up by hockey, figure skating, and other events each season—there is an outdoor rink for people to enjoy during the winter months.

Moosomin's outdoor rink was built a few years ago as an answer to the lack of time for public skating and shinny at the Communiplex, the town's indoor arena.

Since then the outdoor rink has been a busy place, used frequently for games of shinny and by children who just want to have some fun on the ice.

The outdoor rink is 160 by 170 feet and located in Bradley Park, just behind the Communiplex on the south end of town.

Conceived, built, and maintained by volunteers, the ice is reserved for public skating and shinny, and was built with wind breaks so skaters are more comfortable on chilly days. There is also a heated building on site for skaters to change into their skates or just warm up in, and the ice is cleaned regularly by a Zamboni.



The rink is lit at night so that skating can continue into the evening.

If there is an event on at the Communiplex, adjacent to the outdoor rink, there is a concession available inside the Communiplex for snacks and drinks.

The outdoor rink in Moosomin is open to the public completely free of charge.

If you are looking for some free public skating in Moosomin, strap on your skates and join the fun!





## Snowmobiling the Tri Valley Trails

Every winter a group of dedicated volunteers maintains hundreds of miles of snowmobile trails from Fleming to Spy Hill, ensuring local snowmobilers have a safe and scenic ride.

Tri Valley Trails is a local snowmobile club providing safe, groomed trails for riders. The club is also affiliated with Saskatchewan Snowmobile Association (SSA). Since TVT formed 20 years ago it has maintained several miles of trail systems which connect three valleys—the Qu'Appelle, Assiniboine, and the Pipestone. The trail system also joins up with the SnoMan trails (Manitoba system).

Any snowmobile licensed in Saskatchewan also has their trail pass covered in Manitoba, and vice versa, allowing licensed snowmobilers to ride between provinces on one license.

The Tri Valley Trials are designated SSA trails, therefore trail users are required to register their snowmobile.

The club currently maintains 300 kilometres of trail in the Moosomin, Fleming, Rocanville, Welwyn, Tantallon and Spy Hill areas. There are three groomer operators who spend hours grooming the trails each winter, plus a number of volunteers who go out onto the trails at the beginning of the season to stake signs along the trails.

The trails provide a safer way to ride.

Warmup shacks are located at Moosomin, Rocanville, Welwyn, and Spy Hill, and are stocked with firewood for those wishing to take a break and build a fire. There



are also signs along the trails for local businesses who support the trails system, many who provide services to snowmobilers, such as meals, repairs, and accessories.

snowmobilers, such as meals, repairs, and accessories. While a membership in the Tri Valley Trails club is not required to ride the trails, buying a membership is a great way to support the trails system and the club so that the trails can continue to be marked and groomed in the future.

# Cross-country ski trails popular at Rocanville

Whether you're looking for sport, fellowship, exercise, or an opportunity to simply enjoy the outdoors during a Prairie winter day, the Rocanville Cross-Country Ski Club fits the bill.

Since 1995, when local resident Dennis Hack cleared some trails on his farm located two miles south of Rocanville, cross-country ski enthusiasts have strapped on their skis and ventured into Saskatchewan's winter landscape.

Since then, the club has developed into an organization regular members, while many more non-members also take to the nine-kilometre groomed track through the winter.

Even those without skis are included. The Rocanville Cross-Country Ski Club's clubhouse amenities provide everything you need for a day of skiing. The club has all different sizes of boots and skis for rent at low cost, and a wax station to prepare your skis for the day's travel. Payment is based on the honor system.

The clubhouse also has a wood stove for warmth, comfy chairs, and hot chocolate and marshmallows.

The club's trail system contains a variety of tracks, from flat easy-going paths to more challenging hills and coulees. The route winds through bush, providing shelter from a chilly winter breeze.

And, because the club has a facility for all ages and skill levels, the whole family can get involved. While older children can make their first attempt at crosscountry skiing, younger ones can be pulled behind an adult in a sled or toboggan.

The trails are groomed to provide for classic or skate skiing.


The club is a volunteerrun organization and are

required to keep our club



# Esterhazy Super Sledders provide fun and safe snowmobile trails

For those in the Esterhazy area looking for a fun activity this winter, the Esterhazy Super Sledders are a group of dedicated snowmobilers whose members ensure their trails are in the best shape when the snow begins to fall.

The scenic trails are located in the Qu'Appelle Valley stretching from Grayson to Rocanville down the old rail bed (the trail map can be viewed at https://ssa.evtrails.com/#).

The Esterhazy Super Sledders acquired the rail bed system 15 years ago, but have been grooming them and using them since the rail bed system was abandoned 25 years ago.

The Esterhazy Super Sledders is a non profit organization which provides fun and safe ATV/snowmobile trails, and hosts events with the help of its many members donating their time.

"We have a consistent group of members who help take care of the trails and groom them—of course we need some snow before we can do that! We're hoping for some of that this year," said Esterhazy Super Sledders organizer Curtis Abdai. "Pretty much as soon as the snow hits the ground we're out grooming, signing, and getting the trails open.

"As soon as we get enough snow to groom the trail—pretty much anything after a foot—we'll start grooming them and get our signs up and it will show up on the Saskatchewan Snowmobile Association (SSA) website as open. The grooming is all GPS tracked so the SSA knows when we're out grooming and ready to go."

"Typically we have a few work days per year," says Abdai. "We have a few warmup shacks throughout the valley for snowmobiling and we hold woodcutting days and all kinds of random work days with our members. You come when you can and help is greatly appreciated.

"The main contact for our members to stay in touch or for new members interested is our Facebook page. Everybody's electronic these days and it's the best way to stay informed," said Abdai. "We have about 35 active members. We used to have approximately 100. The numbers are dwindling and we're always looking for more members because they're what keeps the trail system alive."

The Esterhazy Super Sledders charge and annual membership fee and the best way to get in touch with them is through their Facebook page.

"We're hopeful it's a busy season with plenty of snow!" says Abdai.

## WELCOME TO ST. LAZARE AND MCAULEY, MB

## History of St. Lazare & RM of Ellice

St Lazare got its beginning as a Roman Catholic mission in the 1820's. It was founded by Oblate Father Jules DeCorby, who had immigrated from France in 1867.

Father DeCorby was at this time attached to the mission at Lebret, Saskatchewan. Father DeCorby named this new mission St Lazare to commemorate the place in France from which he departed on his journey to Canada.

The mission was located at the junction of the Qu'Appelle and the Assiniboine Rivers, approximately 3 miles north of the Hudson Bay Company's Fort Ellice. Church services in those early years were held in the homes of these early settlers, which were mostly Métis families. Since Father DeCorby was very nomadic, traveling from mission to mission, other mission-

aries from Lebret helped with the St Lazare mission, namely Fathers St. Germain, Campeau and Lepage.

In 1880, a log Church was built and Father DeCorby became the first resident priest. At about this time, a French Canadian, Delphis Chartier and family, arrived at Fort Ellice via steamboat and settled at the mission. He eventually opened a post office, October 1st, 1895, and various other businesses. In 1895, Father DeCorby was replaced by Father Léon Favreau and in 1898 a new stone Church was constructed under the supervision of Mr. Chartier. The new Church was blessed by the Archbishop of St Boniface Adelard Langevin, in 1899. A stone rectory was also built at this time.

In 1900, Father Favreau conducted a census of the mission. The census which included men, women and

children was 89 families, 456 souls in all broken down as follows. Métis 342, French Canadians 34, French 15, Irish 30, Scotch 19 and Germans 18. On May 13, 1909, the mission of St Lazare was declared a parish by the Archbishop of St Boniface Adelard Langevin.

On July 7, 1883, the Rural Municipality of Ellice was born, with its headquarters at Fort Ellice. With the decline of the fort and the emergence of St Lazare, its permanent headquarters were moved to St Lazare with the first meeting in the space rented

from Father Favreau on January 6th, 1902. In 1905, the merchants of the mission anticipated the coming of the railway and began relocating to what is the present day location of the Village of St Lazare. Records indicate the railroad opened in 1908.

Many businesses sprung up at this new site, general stores, barber shop, pool room, blacksmith shop, hotel. Eugene Fouillard started a Massey Ferguson dealership. In 1911, a grain elevator owned and operated by the Atlas Grain Company opened its doors.





## Virden full of heritage buildings

Virden is well known for its many restored heritage buildings, dating back to the early 1880s. Architectural styles are varied with most of the heritage being of either fieldstone or brick construction. Many of the structures are unique in Western Canada, in architectural style and purpose. Examples include the Aud Theater, which is unique in style as an example of a restored turn of the century opera house. Another example is St Mary's Anglican Church, whose unique fieldstone construction exemplifies 1800s English style construction using abutments and high pitched roofs. Virden's unique history as an early railroad center has also left the community with a central business district, rich with heritage brick buildings, constructed at the turn of the century. Following is a bit more detail on just a few of the heritage buildings that make Virden unique:

Canadian Pacific Railway Station

Located at 425 - 6th Avenue S, the Canadian Railway Station was constructed in 1900 after the original wood frame station burnt in 1899. It has been restored and declared a heritage building in 1994. Its unique fieldstone and overhanging eaves style was common with many rail stations in larger centers.

In the early years, many new immigrant farmers and businessmen would have first disembarked from the train at this location and passed through the doors of this station. Today, it houses community based organizations including the Virden and Area Arts Council and the Virden Chamber of Commerce. Also included is an art gallery and a separate board room area.

The Aud Theater - 228 Wellington Street

The Aud Theatre was built in 1911 as part of the municipal building. The building was open to the public on February 29, 1912. The building consisted of a government telephone exchange room, new court room, three large offices, and the opera house, costing \$32,500. The population at this time was about 1,500. The Aud Theatre was built by W.T. Manser. The comedy "the Misogynist" was the first to play in the theatre. The Great Eastern Sign Painting Co. of Toronto supplied the 22x30ft curtain. During the '30s and '40s the Aud was a movie theatre. The ceiling on the stage was originally 40ft high but it was lowered to 24ft to save heat. The building was originally heated by steam which was replaced with electric heat in 1984-85 after the renovation and re-opening in 1983. When the theatre fell into disrepair it closed as a movie theatre and the town council was preparing to demolish it. A local steering committee was formed to save it, and after substantial renovations, it was re-opened in 1983. The lower level consists of 257 seats and the upper level consists of 210 seats. The majestic curve of the balcony gives the audience a panoramic view of the stage. On either side of this are two double decker boxes or loges which add an air of sophistication.

### St Mary's Anglican Church - 633 9th Street

This structure is a great example of fieldstone construction. Much of the stone for the fieldstone construction came from along the top of the Assiniboine River Valley. The first church was a frame structure built by Clayton and Sons in 1885. This was the first church building in Virden. Masonry work was done by Mr. Saul of Carberry with carpentry done by Mr. Harrington of Winnipeg. Walter Chesterton, a Winnipeg architect, designed this notable structure while building the school across the street. The

cloister and fence were added in 1952. The church features two stained glass windows created by famous artist and sculptor Leo Mol. The church also features a stained glass medallion window. This window was presented by the city of Brugge, Belgium to honor the 12th Manitoba Dragoons.

#### **Goulding House**

Located at 677 - 9th Avenue, this house is today a private residence. Built in 1893 by Dr. Goulding, the field-stone house represents a prime example of early prairie architectural designs with bi-level verandas and upper look out.

#### Virden Pioneer Home Museum

Located at 390 King Street, and Established in 1970, the museum holds over 6,000 items relating to the Victorian era of Virden's history as displayed in the main house. The original home itself was constructed in 1888 and the three additional annexes were constructed at a later date to display items from subsequent eras depicting our local heritage and culture.





## Ice fishing a popular prairie sport

Ice fishing is extremely popular in Southeast Saskatchewan and Southwest Manitoba, with many people setting up their ice shacks on frozen lakes all winter long hoping to get that perfect catch at just the right time.

Moosomin Lake is known for some great fishing, with people pulling some impressive pike and pickerel

out of the lake over the years.

One of the biggest ice fishing events in the area each winter is the Lake of the Prairies Ice Fishing Derby held at Asessippi Provincial Park. This derby draws fishermen from all over the area. Lake of the Prairies is a man-made reservoir created behind the Shellmouth Dam. The lake experiences excellent walleye, perch, northern pike fishing and carp.

There is also great ice fishing at Clear Lake, located in Riding Mountain National Park.

Ice fishing at both Boundary Dam and Rafferty Dam near Estevan are also a hit, with ice fishing derbies held at both lakes over the years. Nickle Lake near Weyburn is also a popular ice fishing spot with annual derbies.

Round Lake, Crooked Lake and Kenosee Lake are three local lakes in Southeast Saskatchewan that also offer ice fishing opportunities.



# Experience Estevan this winter!

Nestled in the South East pocket of the province, Estevan is a unique destination that boasts a variety of outdoor pursuits and energetic community events. The city lies just minutes from the Souris River, multiple campgrounds, and two large bodies of water (Boundary Dam and Rafferty Reservoir). In the winter months these areas become a playground for outdoor enthusiasts.

Cross Country Skiing and Snowshoeing

Immediately outside of the city, visitors are greeted by the woods lining the banks of the Souris River. This area is home to Woodlawn Regional Park, Rotary Park, Preddy Trails and the Twister Totter bike path. The Preddy Trails as well as the trails through the parks are maintained throughout the winter which makes them an excellent area for cross country skiing and snowshoeing. Skiers and snowshoers can enjoy the calmness of the woods with frequent wildlife sightings as well as the view of the winding river. When fully frozen and safe, the river also makes a wonderful path for both of these pursuits.

While skiers need to provide their own gear, people wanting to snowshoe can borrow snowshoes from the Estevan Public Library during their operational hours. Anyone with a valid Saskatchewan Library Card is welcome to borrow snowshoes and hit the trails.

During this season of early sunsets, Woodlawn Regional Park is a welcome sight as the lampposts lining the campground light up at dusk. This allows for evening skiing/snowshoeing and makes for a great place

to build a fire to cap off your day.

**Ice Fishing** 

Rafferty Reservoir is accessible just 15 minutes out of Estevan and is teeming with fishing opportunities. On the end of your line you're likely to find Northern Pike, Walleye or Perch. Rafferty stretches for 10 km so there's loads of space to find a spot on the ice. If you're looking for a spot that's going to produce a ton of fishing action we recommend getting in touch with Ralph Smart of Prairie Pro Outfitters. Estevan is fortunate to have a fishing guide of Ralph's caliber and Prairie Pro owns exclusive guiding rights to Rafferty. This winter they will be offering ice fishing guiding, shack plus equipment plus electronics rentals and possibly even overnight shelters! We can't wait to see the Ice Camping experience come to our area.

If staying on the ice isn't your thing, we have plenty of newly built and newly renovated hotels to keep you warm and well rested so you can get in a couple of days of fishing.

Twinkle Tour and Festival of Lights

The energy city really shines during the Christmas season. During the month of December many homes in the area participate in decorating for Christmas. This year, Tourism Estevan and the Estevan Mercury are partnering to sponsor a holiday decorating contest. Homes will submit pictures of their outdoor light displays for judging and each week the Mercury will add homes to the Twinkle Tour Map posted in the paper along with a fun Twinkle Tour Scavenger Hunt. While the contest deadline for participants is December 16 you can do the

Twinkle Tour any time. After making your way through the city lights, the best grand finale is to head over to Woodlawn Regional Park to view the Festival of Lights (December 17 January 8). Here, local businesses and organizations create light displays in the campground and cars can drive the loop to view the lights. Every year the displays get more creative and more grand.



Stretching and toning legs: Stretching and toning your legs is a way the players workout before playing the game. The stretching and toning not only helps with flexibility for the game but it also carries out in day-to-day activities.

**Promotes weight-loss:** Sliding on ice burns a lot of calories, yet because you are playing on ice, you don't perspire as much. Curling requires a lot of sliding back and forth, which burns calories.

It can be done by anyone, including the disabled: Curling is a sport that can be enjoyed by everyone, no matter the age or ability. In fact, the Paralympic Games feature a Wheelchair Curling event.

Fun and interactive: It is a sport for both men and women and is played by both adults and kids of all ages. Not only is it a great way to meet people who have the same interest in curling, but it can be a great networking medium. In addition, many people with depression turn towards curling because it's a fun and interactive sport that opens up their social realm.



#### The Arena

Housed inside the Enns Brothers Communiplex, the Arena is an excellent community facility that is utilized by all ages. In the winter months it is home to many Minor Hockey Teams, rec teams and the Melita Skating Club. It contains a licensed concession area, washroom facilities and offers a large parking area. The arena is used for other off season events such as weddings, trade shows and dances. The arena was built in 1972. In 1974 an artificial ice surface was added. Its bleachers seat 800 and a lobby area capacity of 250 people and is fully accessible.

#### Curling

Housed inside the Enns Brothers Place, the Curling Rink provides a sport that is very popular in Melita. The community has an active curling league for men, women, mixed, seniors and school teams. This modern facility is located in the heart of Melita's recreation facilities. It is adjacent to the swimming pool, arena and golf course. The rink has four sheets of artificial ice, waiting and viewing areas. The rink sees a lot of action hosting curling bonspiels throughout the winter months.

#### **Bowling**

Melita has a six lane, five pin bowling alley located on Main Street. There are active leagues for men, women, mixed, seniors and school as well as open bowling. Parties and other event bookings are welcome! Open first weekend

in September until the beginning of June. Off season bowling during Tuesdays at 2 pm.

#### **Fitness Centre**

Located at 73 Main Street at the south door of the bowling alley. A wide variety of machines are offered: Treadmills, Bowflex elliptical, free weights and more. The fitness centre is maintained and operated by a volunteer board. The hours of operation are 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

#### Kinsmen Outdoor Arena

Located east of the Melita School, it features a heated change room and lighted ice surface. This area was built in 1984 and is still well utilized to this day.


